REPORT OF THE CONSTITUTION COMMITTEE TO THE 73rd CONVENTION

The Constitution Committee met in the city of Washington, D.C., beginning 1 2 May 17, 2011, for the purpose of reviewing and considering proposed amendments to the CWA Constitution. 3 4 5 The Constitution provides under Article XVI, Section 2, that the Constitution Committee is "charged with the duty of considering and 6 reporting to the Convention and to the Executive Board on proposals to 7 change this Constitution." Article XXVIII, Sections 2 & 3, provides that 8 amendments submitted to the Constitution Committee sixty (60) days or 9 more in advance of the Convention will require a majority vote of the 10 Delegates present to be enacted. All other amendments to the Constitution 11 proposed at the Convention shall require a three-fourths (3/4) vote of those 12 voting to effectuate such proposed amendments, but in no event shall the 13 three-fourths (3/4) vote of those voting thereupon be less than a majority 14 vote of the approved delegates at the Convention. 15 16 17 The Constitution Committee held meetings in Las Vegas, Nevada, beginning July 8, 2011, after the preliminary report was issued on May 20, 2011. 18 19 This report sets forth all proposed amendments that have been received by 20 the Committee to date. 105 suspensions/expulsions are defensive to protect the union by removing	from
106 its ranks persons who have exhibited intent to undermine and remove th	ne
107 union as the bargaining representative.

109 The language in Article XIX, Section 2, as currently written, could be fou	•
110 the Board to be a "threat" of a monetary fine, even if no fine was imposed	1, and
111 could subject CWA to charges before the NLRB.

142	The purpose of this amendment is to change the recall petition requirements
143	from twenty percent (20%) of a Local's membership to twenty percent (20%) of
144	the members represented by the Local officer being recalled.

146	In addition, the amendment would require a report and recommendation in
147	writing to the Local governing body if a petition does not meet the twenty
148	percent (20%) threshold required by the Constitution.
149	
150	These amendments arose after a recall petition was submitted to Local 6171.
151	The Secretary Treasurer, after review, returned the petition to the six (6)
152	members who submitted it with a cover letter, noting the petition did not meet
153	the twenty percent (20%) threshold for recall required by the Constitution.
154	The Committee discussed these amendments with both the maker of the
155	amendment and the Secretary-Treasurer of the Local.
156	
157	The maker of this amendment states in his explanation that the same
158	members who elect an officer should be the ones entitled to recall him/her
159	and that a written report and recommendation of the petition outcome should
160	be required to the governing body of the Local.
161	
162	After careful review of this proposal, the Constitution Committee does not
163	recommend its adoption for the following reasons:

167 168 169 170	1. Locals have unique structures that are not taken into account by this proposal; for example, in some Locals, officers elected by only a portion of the membership may be assigned additional duties on behalf of the entire membership.

176 177 178 179	3. The proposal to change the reporting of a recall petition is vague and does not specify which of the five (5) requirements listed in Article XXI, Section 2, would be impacted.

At the 2006 CWA Convention, the delegates adopted Resolution 1 "Ready for 313 the Future: 10 Steps To Strengthen Bargaining Power," which instructed the 314 315 Board to make proposals to right-size the Board by 2011. In 2010, Districts 2 and 13 and the C&T and Telecom Sectors combined. This action eliminates 316 two Vice Presidents in 2011 and saves the Union a projected \$800,000. The 317

- 318 current proposal to eliminate the EVP continues the mandate adopted in
- Ready for the Future to right-size the Board and results in additional savings. 319
- 320
- 321 The announced retirement of Secretary-Treasurer Jeff Rechenbach provides an opportunity for this cost-saving restructuring. During these times of 322
- unprecedented attacks on the labor movement and membership losses, it is 323
- 324 critical that we allocate resources in the most effective way possible. If the
- EVP position is eliminated, we will still have two principal officers and 13 full-325
- time Vice Presidents. 326
